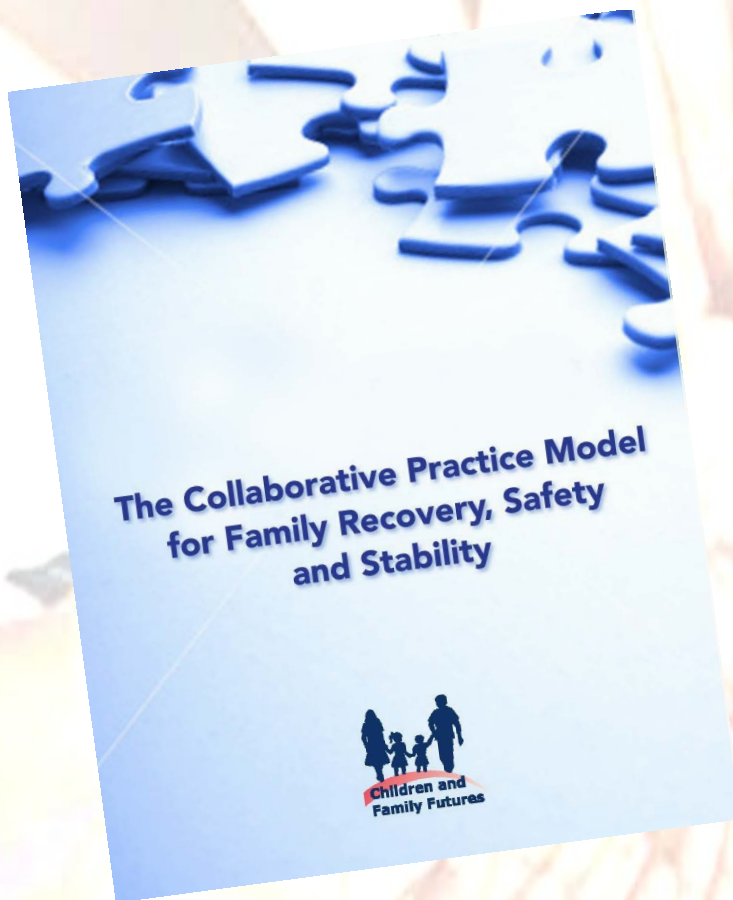


The Collaborative Practice Model for Family Recovery, Safety and Stability
