Denver EFFECT Program



Denver EFFECT is a program designed by Denver Human Services Department of Child Welfare to provide comprehensive and coordinated treatment for families affected by substance abuse.

Who makes up a Family?

- ◆ Members of your immediate family (parents, siblings, partner, children)
- ◆ Extended family
- ◆ Friends
- ◆ Colleagues from work
- ◆ Mentors
- ◆ Anyone who will support recovery

What to expect

While involved with Denver EFFECT the following family-centered services will be provided:

- ◆ Substance abuse treatment
- ◆ Family-centered case management
- ◆ Individual, group, child and family counseling
- ◆ Parenting skills and training
- ◆ Trauma-informed services



- ◆ Information on substance-exposed newborns, infants, and young children
 - ◆ Community Resources
 - ◆ Legal support
 - ◆ Training for relatives and foster families regarding the special needs of children and youth impacted by parental substance abuse and / or parents who are in substance abuse treatment
- ◆ Child care while caregivers are attending treatment

Referrals for Services

The family will also receive referrals for other needed services, such as:

- ◆ Mental Health evaluations and counseling
- ◆ Domestic violence, grief and loss, or sexual abuse counseling
- ◆ Medical care, including prenatal and pediatric
- ◆ Developmental assessment and services
- ◆ Vocational assessment and services
- ◆ Aftercare services and support
- ◆ Transportation

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
