Initial Network Members

Clinical Supervisors

1. Clinical Supervisor is doing clinical supervision with clinicians in a setting that lends itself to receiving referrals from DHHS for the specialized **SA-CW Assessment/Evaluation**
2. Clinical Supervisor has experience with and understanding of substance abuse assessment/evaluation.
3. Clinical Supervisor is ready, willing, and able to participate in a one day training session and initially do these assessment/evaluations to gain competency
4. Clinical Supervisor will commit to help sustain this initiative by identifying, mentoring, and supporting one or two of their independently licensed supervisees in gaining competence as well

Clinical supervisors completing the initial training will be contacted by the Office of Substance Abuse (OSA) regarding participation in the **Families Affected by Substance Abuse Network (FASA)**.

1. Once contacted, trained clinical supervisors can submit a request for approval and listing as a provider of this service.
2. Approved and listed FASA Network Clinical Supervisor Providers will be provided with support in order to achieve mastery of this process.
3. When mastery is documented, the FASA Network Clinical Supervisor Provider will be authorized to identify specific independently licensed clinician(s) within their agencies/practices, whom they will support, and mentor in achieving mastery in this assessment process.
4. When an authorized FASA Network Clinical Supervisor Provider determines that a clinician has mastered the specialized assessment process, the clinical supervisor can submit a request to the Office of Substance Abuse (OSA) regarding their participation in the **Families Affected by Substance Abuse Network (FASA)**.
5. Approved independently licensed clinicians will be listed as FASA Network providers and will continue to be provided with support by FASA Network Clinical Supervisor Providers.
